Course Description:	This PEC will introduce first- and second-year medical students to foundational drawing techniques, with the aim of fostering creativity, fostering self-expression, and teaching how to visually communicate medical topics to patients and colleagues. In addition, students will translate artistic observation skills to a clinical context. A good physician, like a good artist, must be a keen observer of their world.  In this course, students will learn different drawing and cartooning techniques. Each student will also create a 1-page patient education comic on a topic of their choosing.  The course director, Dr. Bitterman, is a Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation doctor who draws comics about working in healthcare.

Objectives:	Students will:
	<ul> <li>Learn and practice fundamental principles of drawing</li> <li>Apply these principles to their experience as medical trainees, to better understand diseases and disorders, and to empathize with patients' experiences</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Critically analyze the relationship of art and medicine</li> <li>Improve their clinical observation skills by learning how to better observe and "read" artwork</li> </ul>
Pre-Requisites:	None

Requirements:	<ul> <li>Keep a sketchbook and draw in it daily (with short assignments) for the duration of the PEC</li> <li>Create a 1-page patient education comic based on a topic of the student's choice</li> </ul>

#### Course Syllabus:

#### Session One – Intro to Art and Medicine, Learning to See

- Interactive lesson on basic drawing techniques
- Opening drawing exercise "Alternate Identities"
- Brief lecture on arts and medicine and "learning to see" (observing things as they are, not as our minds think we see them)
- Drawing exercises practicing the skill of "learning to see"

# Session Two - Visual Arts and Expression

- Opening drawing exercise "10 Second Cat"
- Interactive lesson on "drawing" emotions
- Drawing exercise illustrating a patient narrative
- · Interactive lesson on making comics
- Drawing exercise illustrating a personal narrative

# Session Three -Visual Communication in Medicine

- This session will be about communicating different medical topics through visuals (whether that be single illustrations, diagrams, or comics) and how to distill complicated information into easily readable images
- Tentative plan to have a professional medical illustrator be a guest speaker for this session

### Session Four – Visual Arts and Patient Care

- This session will tie the first session's focus on "learning to see" (in an art context) to "learning to see" in a medical context (in particular, observing things closely during a patient encounter)
- Students will also share their final project (a 1-page patient education comic) with each other and discuss their creative approach
