Course Description:	During this 4 session mini-elective, students will review thoracic, abdominal, and extremity anatomy as they scan each other. This will be a hands-on course that will focus on sonographic anatomy and introduce aspects of the physical exam and clinical management. Students receive links to short focused educational videos they review before each session and the entire hour is spent scanning their peers

	 Ultrasound Basics (physics, how to use the system, indications for different probes, doppler, color) while reviewing the anatomy of the neck. Abdominal Ultrasound Musculoskeletal Ultrasound Cardiac Ultrasound
